The Danger Zones are
anywhere you find **UXO**.

What are UXO?

UXO = UneXploded Ordnance
UXO = mortars, bullets, etc.

All UXO are dangerous!

During World War II, the U.S.
Army used Dolly Sods for
target practice.

Some of the ammunition,
mortar shells, and other UXO
are still in the ground.





Recognize

● UXO can be found in many shapes and sizes. UXO may look new or old, shiny or rusty, clean or dirty.

- **Do not touch** anything that can be UXO.
- All UXO can kill or injure.



Retreat

- Leave the area.
 - Go back the way you came.
- Use a pencil to help Wally find his way to the safe zone.

Hi kids. I'm Wally, the Woodchuck. I live here at Dolly Sods.

I would like you to learn the three Important Rules of UXO safety.

If you learn what to do, you can keep friends, family, and yourself safe on your visit here.

Here are photos to help you Recognize UXO.

If you Recognize UXO, stay at least **50 feet away**.

To point out UXO:

1. Make an arrow using rocks.
2. Hang a bandana.
3. Make an arrow with sticks.



Using one of the 3 ways shown above, point to the location of the UXO.
