Reservation services interrupted for Corps campgrounds and shelters

Huntington, W.Va....Reservation services for U.S. Army Corps of Engineers recreation facilities through the National Recreation Reservation Service (NRRS) will not be available from Oct. 1 through Oct. 16, 2007. During this two-week period, the NRRS call center (877) 444-6777 and Internet site (www.recreation.gov) will be unavailable to accept reservations, changes or cancellations for campgrounds and recreation facilities. The interruption in service begins midnight eastern time Sept. 30 through 10 a.m. eastern time Oct. 17, 2007.

This service interruption will allow for conversion to a new reservation software system designed to improve recreation reservation service. Customers can begin using the new system beginning Oct. 17.

Several campgrounds in the Huntington District use the NRRS system for reservations. They include Bulltown Campground at Burnsville Lake; Gerald R. Freeman at Sutton Lake; East Fork Campground at East Lynn Lake; and Battle Run Campground at Summersville Lake. This also includes reservations for group picnic shelters at Beech Fork, Bluestone, Burnsville, East

Lynn, R.D. Bailey, Summersville, and Sutton Lakes in West Virginia; Dewey, Fishtrap, and Grayson, Lakes in Kentucky, and John W. Flannagan Lake in Virginia.
