The slabs can be rolled up like a blanket and rolled into the water when being placed. This type of ramp is intended for administrative use only.

5) Existing Structures

The two-story brick house that exists on the site will be used as an administrative office, visitor and educational center. The house will be rehabilitated and maintained in accordance with "The Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation and Guidelines for the Rehabilitation of Historic Buildings, " as required by the 1986 Advisory Council on Historic Preservation Memorandum of Agreement. The barn adjacent to the administrative office will be used for equipment storage. All other structures will be demolished and removed from the site.

6) Nature Trail

A nature trail will be developed at the Glenwood Bend Site providing access to various habitat areas of the wetland. Starting at the administrative office and visitor center, the trail will meander through the various habitats of the wetland area offering the user a variety of views and experiences. The trail will be eight feet wide and hard surfaced to provide access for the handicapped. (See Figures 9-08 and 9-09.)

A raised observation deck will be constructed to provide the user with an overview of the wetland area. (See Figure 9-10.)

E. GALLIPOLIS LAUNCH SITE
