## REVISION TO PUBLIC NOTICE NO. 200401005

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** a public workshop will be conducted by the Huntington District United States Corps of Engineers Regulatory Branch to discuss permitting requirements relating to surface coal mining activities. The purpose of this workshop is to provide applicants and their agents with an overview of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act permitting requirements. Section 404 of the Clean Water Act requires authorization from the United States Corps of Engineers for the discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States. This educational workshop will focus on determining the jurisdictional limits of waters of the United States, performing an alternative analysis for avoidance and minimization of waters of the United States pursuant to 40 CFR 230, and preparing a compensatory mitigation plan to offset the loss of waters of United States. Attendance is open to the public.

**DATE:** 26 August 2004

**TIME:** The workshop will begin at 9:00 a.m. and end at 4:00 p.m. with a lunch break between 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m.

**LOCATION:** The workshop will take place at the Ramada Plaza Hotel located at 400 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue and B Street in South Charleston, West Virginia. From I-64, take Exit 56-Montrose Drive. Take a right at the light and proceed into the extreme right lane. Bear right again following the cloverleaf to 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue. Proceed straight one block to the Ramada Plaza Hotel on B Street.
