B. Typical year assessment(s): [A typical year occurs over a rolling thirty year period and includes the analysis of precipitation and other climatic variables to establish a normal period range \(seasonally or annually\) for a specific geographic region where the aquatic resource occurs. One point-in-time data source, 5 March 2020 , with a corresponding APT report, were included in the evaluation for the excluded features onsite. The antecedent precipitation tool was utilized to determine typical year for point-in-time data sources. Wetland adjacency was assessed on 5 March 2020. Based on the antecedent precipitation tool, 5 March 2020 is included during the WebWIMP wet season and has a Palmer Drought Severity Index of moderate wetness. The 30-day rolling total for precipitation was higher than the 30-year normal range. Therefore, site conditions are higher than the typical year conditions. Even at a higher than normal range the wetlands still had no adjacency and did not abut the \(a\)\(2\) streams located onsite.](#)
