**B. Typical year assessment(s):** [A typical year occurs over a rolling thirty year period and includes the analysis of precipitation and other climatic variables to establish a normal period range \(seasonally or annually\) for a specific geographic region where the aquatic resource occurs. Three \(3\) point-in-time data sources dated 2 October 2016 with corresponding antecedent precipitation tool \(APT\) reports, are included in the evaluation for the features listed above, as applicable. According to the APT report for 2 October 2016, wetter than normal conditions with an antecedent precipitation condition score of 9 was observed during the WebWIMP wet season with a Palmer Drought Severity Index Value of normal.](#)
