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data source dated 15 September 2020, with a corresponding antecedent precipitation tool (APT) report, is included in the evaluation for the features listed in Section II D, as applicable. According to the APT report for 15 September 2020, wetter than normal conditions with an antecedent condition calculation of 15 were observed during the WebWIMP dry season with a Palmer Drought Severity Index Value of mild wetness. The 30-day rolling total for precipitation was above the 30-year normal range. During the 15 September 2020, Stream 1 exhibited flow within the stream channel which corresponds with the APT report conditions. Stream 1 is depicted as Sycamore Creek on the USGS topographic map, NWI map, and the NHD. Field indicators of perennial flow were also observed. Stream 1 included a clearly defined bed and bank, coarse bed material (cobble and gravel), riffles, and low sinuosity. Based on the submitted information, Stream 1 contributes perennial flow downstream indirectly to the Scioto River, an (a)(1) water, in a typical year. Therefore, Stream 1 is an (a)(2) water. Wetland B directly abuts Stream 1. Therefore, Wetland B is an (a)(4) water. Wetland A does not abut a water identified in 33 CFR 328.3(a)(1), (2), or (3), is not inundated by flooding from a water identified in 33 CFR 328.3(a)(1), (2), or (3) in a typical year, is not physically separated from a water identified in 33 CFR 328.3(a)(1), (2), or (3) only by a natural berm, bank, dune, or similar natural feature, and is not physically separated from a water identified in 33 CFR 328.3(a)(1), (2), or (3) only by an artificial dike, barrier, or similar artificial structure. Therefore, Wetland A is not a jurisdictional water of the United States per 33 CFR 328.3(b)(1).
