- B. Typical year assessment(s):** A typical year occurs over a rolling thirty year period and includes the analysis of precipitation and other climatic variables to establish a normal period range (seasonally or annually) for a specific geographic region where the aquatic resource occurs. One (1) point-in-time data source dated 2 March 2021, with a corresponding antecedent precipitation tool (APT) report, is included in the evaluation for the excluded feature listed in Section II D. According to the APT report for 2 March 2021, normal conditions were observed during the WebWIMP wet season with a Palmer Drought Severity Index Value of 0.0 for normal conditions. The 30-day rolling total for precipitation was within the 30-year normal range. Under normal conditions, the wetlands did not meet the definition of an adjacent wetland. The wetlands listed in the table above does not abut a water identified in 33 CFR 328.3(a)(1), (2), or (3), is not inundated by flooding from a water identified in 33 CFR 328.3(a)(1), (2), or (3) in a typical year, is not physically separated from a water identified in 33 CFR 328.3(a)(1), (2), or (3) only by a natural berm, bank, dune, or similar natural feature, and is not physically separated from a water identified in 33 CFR 328.3(a)(1), (2), or (3) only by an artificial dike, barrier, or similar artificial structure.
