- **B. Typical year assessment(s):** The antecedent precipitation tool was utilized to determine typical year for point-in-time data sources. Based on the antecedent precipitation tool, 8 June 2020 is included during the WebWIMP dry season and has a Palmer Drought Severity Index of moderate wetness. The 30-day rolling total for precipitation was higher than the 30-year normal range. Therefore, site conditions are higher than the typical year conditions. Even at a higher than normal range the ditch and swale are not considered jurisdictional features.
- C. Additional comments to support AJD: The project is located outside of the FEMA 100 year floodplain.
