





# PRICHARD WATERLINE REPLACEMENT UPGRADE AND EXTENSION PROJECT

## PROJECT LOCATION MAP




# U.S. Sole Source Aquifers

We have reviewed the above referenced project to determine potential effects on cultural resources. As required by Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as amended, and its implementing regulations, 36 CFR 800: "Protection of Historic Properties," we submit our comments.

According to the submitted information, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) is providing the City of Kenova assistance on a Section 571 waterline replacement project in Kenova and Prichard, West Virginia. The project will involve the installation of approximately 64,060 linear feet (LF) of 12-inch water main, 30 LF of 8-inch water main, 920 LF of 6-inch water main, 70 LF of 4-inch water main, and 60-LF of 2-inch water main. All of the pipe will be laid directly adjacent to portions of Route 52, County Road 18, County Road 20, and Old Route 52. The USACE is considering an area of disturbance measuring 23-feet wide and 3-feet deep for the entire waterline corridor.

Archaeological Resources:

According to our records, the West Virginia State Historic Preservation Office provided comments on the proposed project to the City of Kenova in 2015 prior to the USACE's involvement in the project. In the prior correspondence, our office recommended archaeological monitoring in several sections of the proposed corridor due to the documented presence of site 46WA76 within the proposed corridor and the presence of additional sites immediately adjacent to proposed line locations. After reviewing the project, it is the USACE's recommendation that archaeological monitoring should take place within three defined areas. Area 1 is within the property surrounding archaeological site 46WA76. Area 2 is located between the southern portion of Pritchard and Route 52 where the level of disturbance is unknown. Area 3 is located on property behind a church off County Road 18 that is within a floodplain where the level of disturbance is unknown. We concur with the USACE's recommendation for archaeological

monitoring during construction within the three defined areas. We will provide further comment upon receipt of the report presenting the results of the archaeological monitoring.

Architectural Resources:

The submitted information indicates the proposed project consists solely of buried pipelines installed primarily along existing right-of-way and that there will not be any above ground components related to the project. After review of the submitted information, it is our opinion that no architectural resources eligible for or included in the National Register of Historic Places will be affected by the proposed project. No further consultation regarding architectural resources is necessary; however, we ask that you contact our office if your project should change.

We have reviewed the above referenced project to determine potential effects to cultural resources. As required by Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, and its implementing regulations, 36 CFR 800: "Protection of Historic Properties," we submit our comments.

According to submitted information, the City of Kenova proposes to undertake a waterline extension project that will consist of the replacement of approximately 48,100 linear feet of waterline and the construction of approximately 20,000 linear feet of new waterline. The project does not require any new above ground components (i.e., water storage tank or booster pump station).

A search of our records located two previously documented archaeological sites (46WA68 and 46WA76) within the project's Area of Potential Effect (APE) and three additional archaeological resources immediately adjacent to the APE (46WA82, 46WA121, and 46WA173). These resources include: multi-component prehistoric habitation sites, a mid-nineteenth to mid-twentieth century farmstead, and a prehistoric lithic scatter. Submitted information indicates that a majority of the waterline installation work will occur within existing road rights-of-way. We understand that the replacement lines will not be placed within existing trenches but will be placed as close to the existing lines as feasibly possible. Due to the documented presence of archaeological resources within the project's APE, we have concerns that deposits associated with these resources may be impacted by the project's proposed ground disturbing activities. We, therefore, request that a qualified archaeologist monitor all ground disturbing activities within the highlighted areas on the enclosed map. We ask that the qualified archaeologist be afforded enough time to adequately document any uncovered features or cultural materials. We will provide further comment upon receipt of the results of the requested monitoring.




This letter responds to your correspondence of December 23, 2014, concerning the project referenced above. The Division of Air Quality will only provide feedback on issues relating to air quality. If you determine that your project activity may have other environmental impacts, then you should consult with the appropriate environmental agency for that issue (e.g. the Division of Water and Waste Management should be consulted on potential water quality issues, for instance, if over one (1) acre will be disturbed, a construction stormwater general permit is required).

Based upon current regulatory requirements, the project referenced above as outlined in your letter does not appear to require any pre-construction permits, authorizations, or air quality analyses by WVDAQ except to the extent any of the following apply:

1. It is necessary to burn land clearing debris in order to complete the project; in which case, approval by the WVDEP Secretary or his or her authorized representative is required to conduct such burning (see 45CSR6) or;
2. The project entails the renovation, remodeling, or demolition, either partially or totally, of a structure, building, or installation, irrespective of the presence or absence of asbestos-containing materials, and is subject to 45CSR34 (the asbestos National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) at 40CFR61, Subpart M). If such is the case, a formal Notification of Abatement, Demolition, or Renovation must be completed and timely filed with the WVDEP Secretary's authorized representative and approval received before commencement of the activities addressed in the Notification.
3. Backup or emergency electrical generators may be subject to federal and state requirements and require an air permit in accordance with 45CSR13.


If the project involves demolition, and/or excavation and transportation of soil/aggregates or the handling of materials that can cause problems such as nuisance dust emissions or entrainment or creation of objectionable odors, adequate air pollution control measures must be applied to prevent statutory air pollution problems as addressed by 45CSR4 and 45CSR17. 
